



DO'S & DONT'S IN IMMIGRATION AREA

DO'S

During the immigration inspection process, every passenger is required to:

- Have a valid travel document (passport) with minimum validity at least 6 months.
- Have a valid visa, except those who are exempt from the obligation to have a visa in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.
- Answer questions asked by immigration officers honestly and briefly.
- Comply with biometric inspection procedures, such as fingerprint and face scanning.
- Present proof of sufficient financial evidence to guarantee departure and stay while in Indonesia, such as return or onward tickets, bank book, credit card or sponsorship letter (if required).
- Present proof of booked accommodation reservation or address of residence while in Indonesia, such as a hotel voucher, invitation letter, or domicile certificate (if required).
- Keep the entry or exit stamp given by the immigration officer in your passport as valid proof of immigration entry or exit permit.

DONT'S

During the immigration inspection process, every passenger is prohibited from:

- Commit acts that disturb public or security at immigration checkpoints, such as shouting, fighting, threatening, insulting, or resisting immigration officers.
- Provide to the immigration officials with wrong, false, or misleading information, such as using a fake passport, forging a visa, concealing the purpose of a visit, or providing an unreasonable excuse.
- Refusing to comply with orders or prohibitions given by immigration officials, such as refusing to give passports or other documents, refusing to do biometric or health screening, refusing to show proof of finances or accommodations, or refusing to leave immigration checkpoints if denied entry or exit.

DOs & DON'Ts

Entering the customs area:

Read and fill in Electronic Customs Declaration correctly

Each passenger is required to declare the following items:

-  Animals, fish and plants (including processed products) equipped with an official import permit from the relevant agency
-  Medicines containing psychotropic substances are regulated in Ministry of Health and BPOM regulations presented with doctor's prescription
-  Imported goods that will be used for purpose other than personal use
-  Cash in rupiah or foreign currency worth or equivalent to IDR 100,000,000 (one hundred million rupiah) or more
-  Items for personal use that are purchased or obtained abroad and will not be brought back abroad with a value exceeding USD 500
-  Firearms and ammunition with official permits
-  Medical devices equipped with official import permit from the relevant agency

Goods that are prohibited from entering the customs area:

-  Narcotics and prohibited substances
-  Unlicensed firearms, sharp weapons and ammunition
-  Foreign Banknotes equivalent to at least IDR 1,000,000,000.00 (one billion rupiahs) for individual carry
-  More than 200 cigarettes, 25 cigars, or 100 grams of sliced tobacco/other tobacco products (for ages 18 years and over)
-  More than 1 liter of drink containing ethyl alcohol (for ages 21 years and over)
-  Unreasonable quantities of used goods must be brought into the customs area and not taken back abroad
-  More than 2 mobile phones/tablets/laptop per person for personal use

AGRICULTURAL QUARANTINE

Each passenger is required to declare for the following items:

Animal and plant commodity that are prohibited from entering:

1. Animals and plants, as well as their processed products, must be accompanied by the following documents:
 - For plants and processed plant products: A Phytosanitary Certificate and Import Permit from the relevant official agencies.
 - For animals and processed animal products: A Health Certificate and Import Permit from the relevant official agencies.

2. Detection dogs (K-9) assigned for state duty must be accompanied by a Health Certificate and Import Permit, in addition to other necessary documents from the relevant official agency.

1. Dogs, cats, and monkeys which are considered as carriers of rabies (also known as mad dog disease), especially in areas like the Bali Province, which is currently still experiencing a rabies outbreak.

2. Cows, pigs, and other four-legged animals, including their processed products which can be carriers of the foot-and-mouth disease

3. Plants and processed products containing psychotropic substances:
 - Cannabis (also known as Cannabis sativa)
 - Kava (also known as Piper methysticum)
